



Haben Sie ein Zimmer?

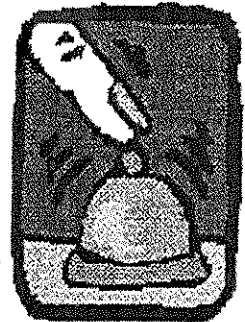


Activity Description

You have just arrived in Munich, one of the most beautiful cities in Germany. Before heading out to explore some of the castles around the city, or even the famous Glockenspiel, you must find a hotel room.

Students will act out a dialogue that would commonly occur between *ein Kunde* and *ein Empfangschef an der Rezeption*. Politely greet each other appropriately *auf Deutsch*. *Der Kunde* will first ask *den Empfangschef* for a room; describe how big (*das Einzelzimmer* or *das Doppelzimmer*) and ask if certain items are included in the room (tv, shower, toilette, towels...). (*Der Kunde* will also have to indicate if he or she wants *das Frühstück* available at the hotel. *Der Empfangschef* will ask for how long *der Kunde* wants to stay. *Der Kunde* will then ask how much the room will cost. Once this is agreed upon, *der Empfangschef* will ask *den Kunden* a few questions to record personal information. Questions asked and answered must include: *der Vorname*, *der Familienname*, *die Adress*, und *die Staatsangehörigkeit*.

Der Empfangschef gibt dem Kunden den Schlüssel (the key), stating the room number and on which floor (*Stockwerk*) the room is located. *Der Kunde* thanks *dem Empfangschef* and asks him or her during what hours *das Frühstück serviert wird*.
